






## IDENTIFYING OGOT COMMUNITIES

# USEFUL TOOLS

Pencil, crayon, or pen





Flashlight



Look for cracks in rocks and pavement.

It is quicker for an ogot to build a home in an existing crack, rather than dig a new hole from scratch.



- Look out for bumblebees. Bumblebees help ogots reach high places.
- Pay attention to the trees. Some ogots prefer living daringly high above the ground.

Look for shiny spots on concrete. A glint is usually a piece of metal or mineral that an ogot has dropped on the way back from a scavenging trip.


